#### Safety tip

Phil Cyr, one of our northern members has been experiencing some out-of-trim conditions on his chute, which of course causes flying to be not straight and level, i.e. have to be constantly making rudder corrections to maintain steady flight. Phil, being our role model for meticulousness, of course researched it with Performance Designs (PD) parachute manufacturer, and came up with some insights that may be valuable to all of us.

I believe most of us have Microline lines for our chutes. Apparently, these stretch over time, and

then start to shrink. This can cause uneven rigging, giving you a constant turn, or other weird control issues in a turn or in some other maneuver. The new lines installed are called Vectran, and supposed to not stretch like Microline.

According to PD, really hard openings will stretch the lines - their sport parachutes experience that sometimes. Not sure how you get <u>really</u> hard openings with our rigs, but I suppose over time it's possible. Also, leaving your chute and lines out in the sun and weather too long will do much damage



to both of those, and of course, entanglements or getting caught in the prop even for an instant can cause that stretching too.

So what can we do? some of Phil's lines were out of norm by 5 to 6 inches. Your owner's manual should specify the normal length for each of the lines, so you

can measure those periodically. If you experience weird out-of-rigging symptoms, you'll probably want to do that soon, and then have your chute relined.

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#### **Safety seminars**

There are a number of FAA sponsored safety seminars given during the year throughout Maine. One of our long-time members, Randy Autrey is a FAAST team representative, and he has a wealth of knowledge regarding any of the safety issues and seminars - contact him if you have any questions in that area.

Besides being a opportunity to hang out for a couple of hours with fellow aviators of all stripes, the safety seminars also give you credit for the oral portion of your biennial flight review (BFR). So in addition to what you might learn at these events, it is also an easy way to get that portion of the BFR out of the way, and then all you have a left is an instructional flight with a CFI.

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### **More winter flying tips**

Here's a good one - stay home! OK, just kidding - winter flying can be exhilarating, peaceful, safe, beautiful, and just plain fun.

However, the preparation time for flying can be tedious, as you're bundled up so look like the Michelin man, and simple tasks like opening the sipper on you parachute bag can take 5 minutes with your trusty one-fingered mitten.

The winter air, of course provides more lift, and generally the winds are calmer and smoother. It is safer to fly as the many, many lakes in Maine provide a lot more landing areas if you have your skis on.



Speaking of skis, here's the useful tip. Most of our skis come with an attachment mechanism consisting of two bolts that run through the flange on the ski through the holes in your wheels, and a nut on the other end Lining them up can be nightmare - you often have to lift the plane off the ground to rotate the tires so it lines up correctly. Not fun, especially with your trusty one-fingered mitten again.

A much better solution is to throw away the bolts, drill a small hole on the edges of the ski, and attach a ratchet strap. The strap goes through the holes in your wheels - no line-up issues there. See picture below.
